**The position:** This is a 3-year Residency and Masters in Veterinary Science training programme that satisfies the requirements for certification by the Royal College of Pathologists (FRCPath), subject to satisfactory annual review of progress. The University of Bristol is one of the few approved training programmes for the European College of Veterinary Clinical Pathology and the option for the candidate to enroll for the European Diploma qualification in Veterinary Clinical Pathology (ECVCP) will be considered. The programme will incorporate a fixed term scholarship working towards a taught Masters in Veterinary Science during the 3 years of the Residency. Residents will be involved in clinical work in the Langford Vets diagnostic laboratories, clinical research and will be expected to submit manuscripts for publication based on their research work during the programme. During the residency you will receive training in clinical haematology, clinical biochemistry, endocrinology, cytology, laboratory management, quality control and quality assurance. Possibilities for expanding knowledge in clinical immunology and clinical microbiology (including molecular diagnostic techniques) will be available. The MSc in Veterinary Science will develop your clinical research skills and enhance universally important skills such as scientific writing, critical reading and statistical analysis of data.
