

Locum Lecturer in Veterinary Clinical Pathology

The Royal (Dick) School of Veterinary Studies wishes to appoint a Locum Veterinary Clinical Pathologist. This 8-months position, beginning in July 2021, is an exciting opportunity to join a vibrant and international team and to contribute to the diagnostic pathology service and teaching of clinical pathology.

Covering all aspects of clinical pathology, though mainly haematology and cytology, the successful candidate will play an important role in the diagnostic work of Easter Bush Pathology. There will also be opportunities to participate in the delivery and assessment of the BVM&S undergraduate teaching programme, to assist with eLearning and on-line teaching initiatives, and to contribute to the training of resident.

You will be based in the new Veterinary School building, opened in 2011 in the Easter Bush Campus, located in Roslin, close to the city of Edinburgh. Interaction with colleagues across the range of disciplines creates a stimulating and rewarding environment, which is ideal for further developing your clinical pathology skills and knowledge.

You will hold a veterinary degree and will be an MRCVS (or eligible to become an MRCVS). You will be qualified in veterinary clinical pathology to diploma level (e.g. DipECVCP, DipACVP (Clin Path) or FRCPath), although Board-eligible candidates are also encouraged to apply. Practical experience in the delivery of a diagnostic clinical pathology service is essential while some teaching experience is desirable.
