Professional Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine (DVetMed) ("Residency") in Veterinary Clinical Pathology

Applications are invited for a Professional Doctorate in Veterinary Medicine (DVetMed) ("Residency") based at Easter Bush Pathology at the Royal (Dick) School of Veterinary Studies, University of Edinburgh.

The scholarship will comprise a four-year training position in veterinary clinical pathology supervised by ECVCP and ACVP diplomates and will include haematology, clinical biochemistry, cytology and laboratory management. A wide range of domestic and exotic species will be covered and there will be the opportunity for externships at other laboratories. The resident will be expected to fully participate in the diagnostic service, regular in-house training sessions, and to contribute to undergraduate teaching. There will also be an opportunity to gain some anatomic pathology experience including necropsy work and histopathology.

The scholarship is available from September 2021 and will run for a four-year fixed-term, renewable annually subject to completion of required DVetMed components.

The resident will be expected to sit the diplomate examination of the ECVCP or ACVP. The examination for Fellowship of the Royal College of Pathologists in Veterinary Clinical Pathology may also be undertaken in addition, if desired. The scholarship also includes the requirement to undertake a research project, with a thesis examined in Year 4.

The scholarship tax-free stipend is £20,018.13 per annum with an additional allowance of £600 per annum available for approved travel, examination fees and CPD. Postgraduate fees will be paid by the University of Edinburgh at UK level. The successful applicant will join a team of two clinical pathologists and a clinical pathology resident, and five anatomic pathologists and two anatomic pathology residents. They will be a veterinary graduate, with ideally two years' experience in veterinary practice or referral service, or a one-year rotating internship. A degree that can be registered with the RCVS is essential. Some prior experience in veterinary clinical pathology is desirable.
